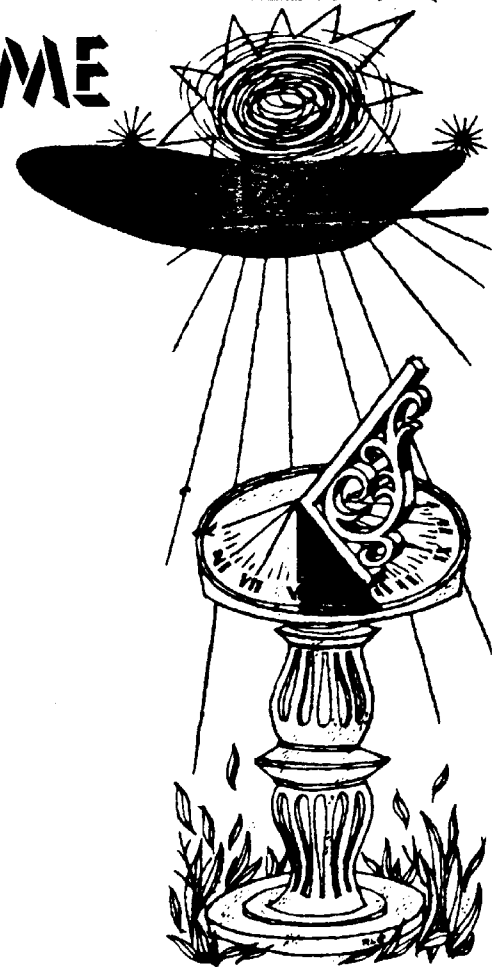
## 1977—ONE DAY AT A TIME

### Why Just Today?

*Since we can't return to yesterday, or project into tomorrow, let's accept the reality of now*

Why do we live our way of life one day at a time? We accept the suggestion. We try it and it works for us. We see it work in others. We see and know in the eyes of another the time that binds him. We see and know the dreamy look of one who wanders in the past. He is not here. He doesn't really see or hear us. He is listening to the echoes of ghosts. He has turned from the vivid reality of now and is haunted by the far away and long ago. The physical existence goes on. His heart beats, his blood circulates, and his lungs function. But his spiritual conception of what he is and the fact that we are there with him, is sound asleep. The dream of what he was or might have been imprisons him. We see and know the sharp, watchful and apprehensive look of the fellow who calculates and anticipates the future. He flicks the reality of now out of his mind as he grapples with tomorrow. He doesn't seem to see or know us. It is in this way that we are not fully present with each other so much of the time. We cannot be fully present with one another in the realm of either memory or anticipation. It is in the reality of now that we are bound together. All parts of time are imagined and life in them is imaginary life. Only the present moment is real, indivisible,

eternal, and the true dwelling place of those who became whole together thru the grace of a Higher Power. Pride and remorse are concerned with the past. If we did well, then we take pleasure and pride in reviewing the remembrance over and over again. That is how we sometimes become dangerously complacent about our sobriety. If we did badly we torment ourselves with remorse, shame and self-pity, the most destructive of human vices. Fear and apprehension are bound up in tomorrow. Anxiety about the unknown is common to us all. Scheming for the future or fearing that which may be unpleasing tomorrow, even though it never happens, does not make life a full and present song. Without being rooted in present love and trust, even hope can become an empty mirage which leads but to a new and greater despair. Devoted as we are to other times and places, we follow such natural instincts in order to escape the "reality of now". All of mercy and all of joy are now. Happiness and sobriety are now, or never. When we live for today, fully met with one another and with God as we understand Him, then will we be wide awake, then will our life become a full and present song of happiness and sobriety. Now is eternity. Each moment of life is a gift, which, when we are through with it, is deposited exactly as we left it, forever in eternity. That past moment can



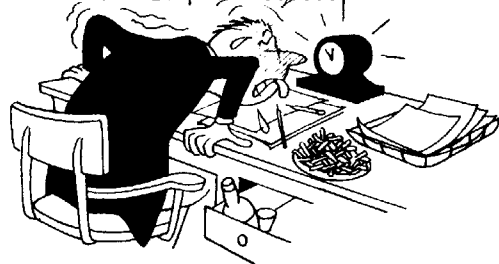
never be recalled. Never can it be undone or redone. If we make amends, the fact of contrition and the act of atonement are NOW in this present new moment of life. To put it another way, it isn't what we were or might have been, nor is it what we may be that really counts. It's what we are today, this very moment, NOW! *Did you ever consider the resolution, determination, fixity of purpose, and willpower an alcoholic demonstrates when working seriously at his drinking?...*



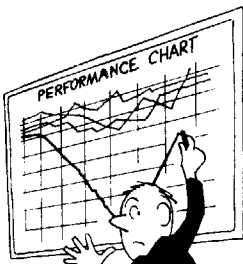
*Why, it required tremendous willpower just to get up in the morning—especially when we knew we weren't going to feel any better later on.*



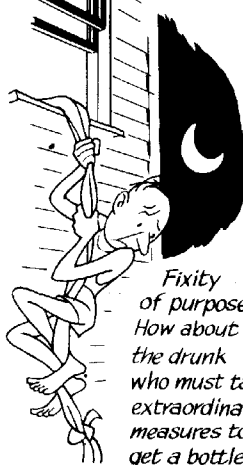
*And how about the determination of the drunk who is spacing his drinks so he can maintain some semblance of sobriety?*



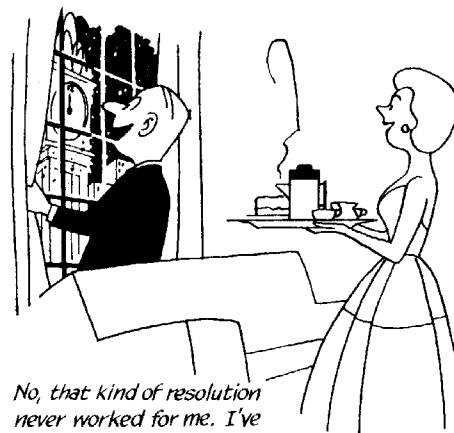
*Think of the mountains we moved trying to find a bottle we had hidden.*

## NEW YORK TO INSTALL COMPUTER

Major changes in handling information affecting each AA group in U.S. and Canada are underway in our New York office. The changes are of a magnitude that it is important that each GSR gradually become aware of them--and thus benefit from the efficiencies of electronic data processing. Following is the latest report from New York on what is happening. ( And you may notice that it tells what it was like, what's happening and what things will hopefully be like ).

"During the past 18 months, we have been making changes in methods and procedures in the stenographic, accounting, records and shipping departments, aimed at improving service. Some improvements are now evident, other results will take longer.

Formerly there were 3 separate lists of Groups at GSO. They were:

- 1) Group Record Cards --the basic records from which directories are compiled.
- 2) A file of address cards from which envelopes were run for all GSO mailings including Box 4-5-9.
- 3) Another file of quarterly group contribution statements. Unfortunately, these three lists did not always agree. A correction made in one was supposed to be made in all three. But there were slips, human errors and gaps in the system. We now have only one basic list of AA groups, and it is maintained on an outside computer. All Changes are put into the computer so the list is as current as possible. This outside computer prints all address labels for all of our mailings whether for Box 4-5-9, quarterly contribution statement and any other purpose. This computer also now produces the AA directories. We are still having some long delays in sending the 1st mailing to new GSRs. We are investiga-

ting ways to correct the procedure. The biggest change of all is the introduction of our own computer. The systems design phase of this project is almost completed, and the computer hardware will be ordered in December (1976). Programming is expected to be completed in early 1977, and the whole system should be fully implemented and running smoothly by mid-1977.

We are realistic enough to realize that there will be many bugs to straighten out as the various functions go on to our computer, and we hope the Fellowship will show their customary patience and understanding. But, the final result will be the capability to handle the continuing growth of AA without being buried in paperwork--and thus better service to the groups."

## DEADLINE FOR UPDATING OF WORLD DIRECTORY INFO REVISED

Jan. 9 is the deadline to get current information about your group to your district committeeman. The deadline was extended because of a delay by New York in getting computer-printed lists of year-old group information to each Area.

These computer-printed lists have now been received by the committeemen for each of the 14 districts within our Mid-Southern Calif. Area.

To make it easy for each GSR to supply fresh information about his group here is how the system will work:

- 1) If you know who your district committeeman is, contact him and give him the current information about your group--even if there has been no change in the past year.
- 2) If you don't know who your district committeeman is, you should still be contacted by him.

(Each district committeeman received from New York a computer-printed list of each group in his district. This List includes the names and phone numbers of two persons in each group. Unless the committeeman knows there has been a revision in your group contact, he will contact the person who is the last-known addressee of the group ).

The system sounds good and should work perfectly--if all district committee men do their job.

However if you have not been contacted get the information about your group to your district committee by the end of December.
