CHARMING IS THE WORD FOR ALCOHOLICS . . . BY FULTON OUSLER

One of the early admirers of this new flowering Fellowship, and a most articulate one . . . published the following in Liberty Magazine in the mid-1940's. "Old Timers" will remember . . . "Newer Members" will love it too!

Down at the very bottom of the social scale of A.A. society are the pariahs, the untouchables, and the outcasts, all known by one excoriating epithet—relatives.

I am a relative. I know my place. I am not complaining. But I hope no one will mind if I venture the plaintive confession that there are times, oh, many, many times when I wish I had been an alcoholic. By that I mean that I wish I were an A.A. The reason for that is that I consider the A.A. people the most charming in the world.

Such is my considered opinion. As a journalist it has been my fortune to meet many of the people who are considered charming. I number among my friends stars and lesser lights of stage and cinema; writers are my daily diet. I know the ladies and gentlemen of both political parties; I have been entertained in the White House. I have broken bread with kings and ministers and ambassadors and I say after that catalog, which could be extended, that I would prefer an evening with my A.A. friends to any

person or group of persons I have indicated. I ask myself why I consider so charming these alcoholic caterpillars who have found their butterfly wings in Alcoholics Anonymous. There are more reasons than one, but I can name a few

They are imaginative, and that helps to make them alcoholics. Some of them drank to flog their ambition on to greater efforts. Others guzzled only to black out unendurable demons that rose in their imagination. But when they have found their restoration, their imagination is responsive to new incantations, and their talk abounds with color and light, and that makes them charming companions too.

The A.A. people are what they are, and they were what they were, because they are sensitive, imaginative, possessed of a sense of humor and awareness of universal truth. They are sensitive, which means that they are hurt easily, and that helped them to become alcoholics. But when they have found their restoration, they are still as sensitive as ever; responsive to beauty and to truth and eager about the intangible glories of this life. That makes them charming companions.

They are possessed with a sense of humor. Even in their cups they have been known to say damnable funny things.

OFTEN IT WAS BEING FORCED TO TAKE SERIOUSLY THE LITTLE AND MEAN THINGS OF LIFE that made them seek escape in a bottle. But when they have found their restoration, their sense of humor finds a blessed freedom, and they are able to reach a god-like state where they can laugh at themselves, the very height of self-conquest. Go to the meetings and listen to the laughter. At what are they laughing? At ghoulish memories over which weaker souls would cringe in useless remorse. And that makes them wonderful people to be with by candlelight.

And they are possessed of a sense of universal truth. That is often a new thing in their hearts. The fact that this at-onement with God's universe had never been awakened in them is sometimes the reason why they drank. The fact that it was at last awakened is almost always the reason why they were restored to the good and simple ways of life. Stand with them when the meeting is over, and listen while they say the "Our Father". They have found a Power greater than themselves which they diligently serve. And that gives them a charm that never was elsewhere on land or sea. It makes you know that God, Himself, is really charming, because the A.A. people reflect His mercy and His forgiveness.

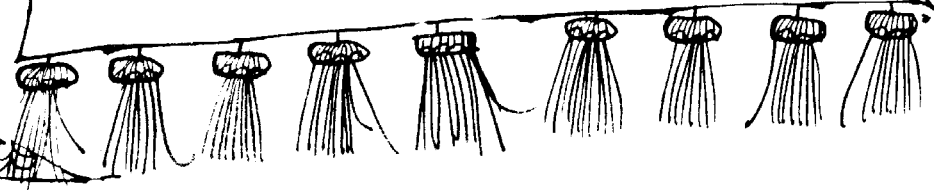

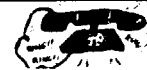

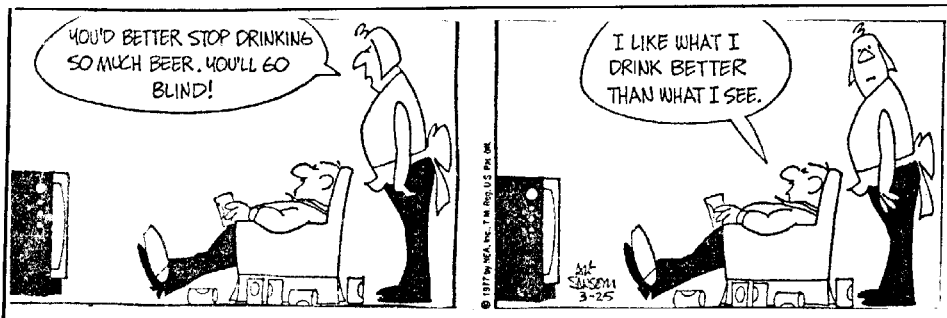

JoAnne A., reported that about 700 were in attendance at the Annual AA meeting Easter Sunday. She also announced that the picnic will be held Sept. 11. A motion was carried to discontinue the Zenith service to Whittier due to excessive costs.

Nominations were made for the upcoming election in May. to fill vacancies left by Service Board members whose terms have expired. Those nominated were: Roberta B. (Tustin) and Helen S., (Huntington Beach), Frank A. (Orange), Joe F., (Brea), and Dick W. (Yorba Linda), the last four eligible for reelection. There will be the election at the next Intergroup meeting, and more nominations will be made next month. Requirement for Board positions is one year's sobriety and hopefully some attendance at Intergroup meetings. It was announced that more names are needed for the answering service. The 12 step list is being updated so call in if you wish to help in this manner. The Big Book is now available at your C.O. in Braille, Swedish, German & French.

The Pacific Region Assembly this year was, in my opinion, one of the best. The Program was built around "The AA Group---Where it Begins" with panels covering all aspects of the AA Group.

It became very clear in the various panels of discussion the importance of having strong groups which are involved in the fellowship as a whole and functioning together, in Unity, if we are to continue to carry the message to the suffering alcoholic. Having a "Home Group" in which we are willing to become involved and serve is vital with the necessity of becoming informed group members about all of our Three Legacies and AA as a whole.

How can this be accomplished? It Has To Begin With Me. One panelist stated, "Drinking stops when we go to AA meetings. Recovery begins when we join a group."

Our Delegate received a letter from an AA member who had just attended this particular Pacific Region Service Assembly and the following excerpts from his letter expressed better than I what occurred to those of us who attended:

"My committeeman insisted I go to the Pacific Region Assembly in Seattle and I, with typical alcoholic justification, insisted I wasn't going. Too much politics, had things to do at home, couldn't see I could benefit from going, and it was beyond my financial abilities. My wife prodded me into going. I went and came back with an emotional feeling I can't describe. You see, I went to Seattle with contempt prior to investigation. I returned with a new attitude, a new understanding of our Third Legacy and a great deal of new knowledge about AA. I can now understand why people go back time and again to the Assembly. For my spiritual growth and maintenance of sobriety, I must give of myself without thought of gain or reward in carrying the message of Alcoholics Anonymous."

And to that I can only say "Count Me In.".....Goldene L., Alternate Delegate

The M.S.C.A. Delegate and some Central Office personal met with the Directors of the DWI Programs in late March. A detailed explanation of the problems and tradition violations in AA is experiencing were discussed.

Copies of the "Information paper for anyone sent to AA for administrators of Court Programs and other referring agencies" were distributed. (This paper was just completed and sent out in March from G.S.O. after a recommendation from the "76" Conference.)

There was an indication of co-operation and some expressed that there will be some changes in their respective programs and material.

AA General Service Offices print a Newsletter for professional men and women titled "About AA"... "The Public Information-Co-operation With The Professional Community Bulletin". Copies of this material will be forwarded to the DWI Programs directors and how they may be obtained.

Phyllis Masback, General Service Staff on the committee for Co-operation With The Professional Community, made the following comments:

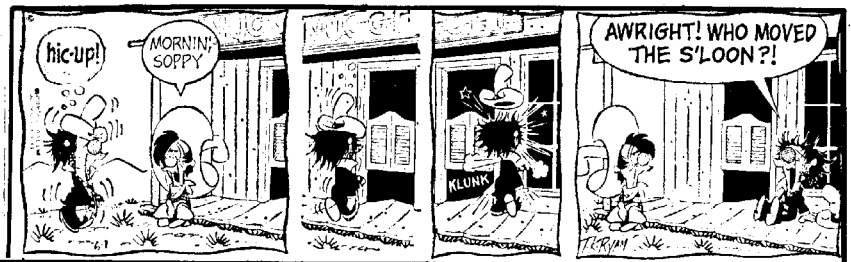
"Enclosed is the material you requested. I'd like to elaborate a little bit about our cooperation with these programs." Whereas most AA groups are happy to cooperate with court programs and other agencies in providing "proof of attendance" at AA meetings, it is contrary to the AA program and to AA principles to keep track of any member's way of giving service to the group or AA as a whole. Specifically, no records are kept on how many hours a member may spend in making coffee for the group, emptying ashtrays, setting up chairs, going on Twelfth Step calls, serving as officers, or any number of things a member may do to contribute to the wellbeing of the members or to the smooth functioning of the meetings."

As you know, in AA we have many paradoxes. We say we must give up in order to gain; we must sometimes fall down in order to stand up, and we must give away our sobriety in order to keep it. All the things we do as group members contributes to giving our sobriety away to the newcomer in order to keep it for ourselves. This is in line with fulfilling our primary purpose which is to carry the AA message of recovery to the still suffering alcoholic. Therefore, any formal recognition of these services would be contrary to the spirit of AA Service."

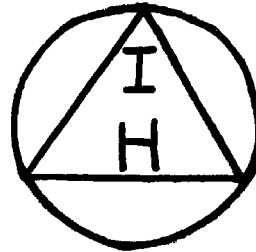

Although we are not affiliated with AA because of Traditions, our program is built on AA principles, and was brought about by the need that sober alcoholics saw for a place to take a woman that needed residential care, and an introduction to the AA Program, 14 years ago. We are proud to say that it hasn't changed much, as 9 out of 10 guests at the Villa are still referrals from AA people.

The only problem we have is that when an AA person brings a gal to our place, most never come back to ever see them or take them to meetings. These gals need sponsors just like we all did and it's very perplexing to us that AA people go on 12 step calls, bring a gal to the Villa and never come back. We ask the person that brings a gal to us to sponsor her while she is in the house, bring her cigarettes if she doesn't have any, call her on the phone, and take her out to a few meetings; let her know she has a friend. As she goes to more and more meetings, she is then able to make other AA friends and choose a sponsor from one of them.

We would like to know if the Central Office is having this same problem when people go on 12 step calls for them, or if you have any ideas on what we can do to let the AA people know how important it is to follow up on a 12 step call, to the new person.
