I felt cheated because I can't have a few drinks to loosen up and laugh. One afternoon after a grueling day at the restaurant I sat myself down with my finest wine glass in hand, filled with my favorite cranapple juice to talk myself out of that drink I felt I deserved. My January Lifeline had been sitting on my table for over a week and I hadn't made the time to read it. I know I was waiting for some miracle to remove my need to have a drink. I know I was silently hoping for help because I didn't find the power at that time to keep up my battle. I read the front page but needed more. Inside was another short piece about holding myself prisoner. Then I noticed a title that sounded very familiar. I read on. That miracle I so badly needed was there waiting to be presented at the right moment. All I could say was "thank you God for once again restoring my faith and reinforcing my understanding that I don't travel this road alone. When everyone else rose their glasses to toast the holidays I felt at peace and more joy than any glass of champagne had ever brought me. The greatest gift I gave myself and my children this year was sobriety.

I sent a copy of that Lifeline to a friend in Minnesota and he shared it at his last meeting. Wherever I reach with my writing there seems to be someone helped and someone to help. Each day I find the power of A.A., the power of the believers behind the organization is stronger than any group I've ever known. Each day I continue contact with people with this common cause the way becomes more clear.

I have a lot to share and will find the time to continue to write. I will be sending these things to you as often as possible. Thank you for the part you played in restoring my faith. Thank you for being there. Sincerely, Susan C.

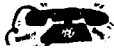

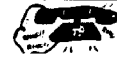

Topics on the agenda of the 30th annual meeting(1980) of the General Service Conference of AA, (U.S. and Canada), which convenes at New York's Hotel Roosevelt April 20-26, the theme of which is "Participation: Key to Recovery" will include:

1) The Right of Decision. 2) Participation---equal voice, equal responsibility. 3) Participation---service and recovery. 4) Reaching the Alcoholic by working with non-alcoholics. Election of two regional trustees for four-year terms is also scheduled. The Western Canada (Alberta, British Columbia, Manitoba, North-west Territory, Saskatchewan, Yukon) member of the General Service Board will replace Cecil E., Prince Albert, Sask. The new West Central U.S. (Iowa, Montana, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wyoming) trustee will fill the position vacated by Don N., Moorhead, Minn. Others rotating off the board in 1980 are non-alcoholic John D. Bealer, M.D., Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, and general service ("in town") trustee Edward S. of New York City. "How well is the Conference structure working?" is the topic for one evening session. Three questions included in that examination are: (a) the role of "intown" trustees and how they are elected;(b) extending delegates' terms from two to three years; and (c) should 75% of the Conference vote be in the hands of the area delegates? These ideas have often been studied by past Conferences, but it is generally agreed that if AA is to grow along with the world around it, the Fellowship can profit from continually taking its own inventory.

As a result of a significant increase in group contributions to AAWS in New York, effective February 1 the price of all literature distributed by our General Service Office has been reduced on orders of \$25 or more by six percent. Local AA central offices and intergroup associations are also entitled to the reduction and it is hoped that they will pass the savings on to the AA groups that are their customers. This marks the second slash in literature prices resulting from a Conference recommendation in 1976. The Conference felt that lessening the profit AAWS was making on literature might encourage groups to increase their contributions. It was believed this would help AA become more nearly self-supporting--less dependent on profits derived from the sale of books and pamphlets. It is the purpose of AA to carry the message, not to amass profits.

The Third Annual San Diego Spring Roundup convenes Friday, Saturday and Sunday, April 4, 5 & 6 at the San Diego Twon and Country Convention Center. Principal speakers are (AA) Sandy B. of Washington D.C., and (AI-Anon) Gloria S. of Los Angeles. All the usual attractions will likely be enjoyed by many from our own Area. Have fun in sobriety!

PROFANITY---REFUSAL TO CHANGE. (We found this in the Hello Central, publication of the L.A. Central Office. We are passing it along for what you may think it is worth. It is originally from the DRY RUN, publication in Boston, Mass.)

You've been getting a pretty steady diet of "suggestions" from speakers, writers to Dry Run, Central Office and others that the use of profanity and vulgarity from the speaker's podium should be stopped. This is not because of the offended sensibilities of your listeners (although there are plenty of offended sensibilities) but because of the continued use of foul language is clear evidence of an unwillingness to change. And in case you refused to absorb the last part of the preceding paragraph here it is again: "Continued use of foul language is clear evidence of an unwilling ness to change."

(No reference intended to the occasional offender who simply hasn't managed to gain control of his language use. Time, good old time, will take care of that misuse.)

The person, male or female, who continues to insist it is his or her right to insult the audience with intentional vulgarity is merely expressing aloud the unwilling ness to change that he or she might not even recognize. Whether it is an ego problem (and the occasional guffaws from the audience are somehow boasting the speaker's ego) or a flat refusal to grow up, the vulgar speaker cannot but realize he or she is refusing to change...
