JUNE 10, 1935 — JUNE 10, 1981 Alcoholics Anonymous Celebrates Forty-six Years of Hope for Alcoholics

Last month Alcoholics Anonymous celebrated its forty-sixth anniversary. Since I haven't even been alive for 46 years, I can't share with you first hand information on the beginnings of AA, but there is an abundance of written material on our history, and I've done alot of reading!

It is really incredible to me that my life and the lives of countless others could be so dependent on the "chance" meeting of two men over forty-six years ago.

Most of you will remember Bill's spiritual experience in which he realized that if he would work with other alcoholics he would not have to drink again. You recall also the business trip to Akron that fell through leaving him very depressed. He was faced one more time with the choice of drinking or not drinking — and to my great joy he made the phone call that led to his meeting with Dr. Bob. It was very interesting to me that Dr. Bob wasn't able to stay sober from his first meeting with Bill — he found it necessary to attend a medical convention to quench his thirst for knowledge and managed to quench his thirst for scotch at the same time. When he returned, Bill, while getting him ready to perform surgery that morning, gave him what was to be his last beer. That became the anniversary date of Alcoholics Anonymous — June 10, 1935.

The trials and triumphs of the early AA's are recorded in books and pamphlets for all of us to share and hopefully to learn from. I have come to believe in the necessity of the twelve steps for individual recovery and the twelve traditions for group unity. I am grateful to Bill for being concerned enough for the welfare of AA that, in 1950, he turned the ultimate responsibility for AA over to the fellowship through the Conference. It is inspiring to me that these two men would strive for humility throughout their entire lifetimes in AA even though they could have exploited their positions as co-founders and trusted servants and become Godlike. I would like to think that I could put Alcoholics Anonymous before the desires I have always had for money, property and prestige — but I'm not sure.

There have been many movements prior to AA that have tried to help alcoholics (with varying degrees of success), including the Oxford Group and the Washingtonians. In the article Milton Maxwell wrote in 1955, he compares the Washingtonians with Alcoholics Anonymous. He points out, at the end of the article, the basic similarities and differences between the two. Both had primary purposes of helping the drunk — in the beginning — but the Washingtonians got lost in affiliation with the temperance movement, making public speeches, association with political figures, etc. These are things that our Twelve Traditions will prevent as long as each of us is willing to do our part in seeing that they are adhered to.

The decline of the Washingtonians was as rapid as its beginning.

Birthdays and anniversaries have always been a time of reflection for me. I always look back over the year prior to each of my AA birthdays (with all of the objectivity I can muster) and see the changes, growths and failings. Each year I make a conscious decision to try harder to do my share in Alcoholics Anonymous. It is easy for all of us to get busy enjoying the new lives AA enables us to live and forget what our primary purpose is — and has always been — TO CARRY THE MESSAGE OF SOBRIETY TO ALL WHO STILL SUFFER. It seemed to be easier in the early days of AA not to wander too far away from the primary aim of the program — most of the pioneer AA members were totally broke and had been reduced to such a level, they had nothing else to do. But all through their lives, Bill and Bob both stressed the necessity of Love and Service, giving for fun and for free of what you have found here.

As I reflect on the last forty-six years of Alcoholics Anonymous, I notice that it seems to be getting more and more difficult to find people who are willing to commit themselves to some type of service work (Intergroup, General Service, H & I, Twelve Step Work, etc.).

I have been in our Central Office when volunteers have made twenty-five calls to try to get help for a wet one, only to be met with excuses that range from "I have out-of-town guests" to "I'm sorry, I haven't got time, I'm on my way to a meeting"! I have been in a meeting of 200 people where the Secretary has been unable to find five people to wash cups.

I understand that times are changing and that we need to be flexible, but is it wise to stray too far from the very simple tools of love and service that worked so well for our forefathers? Can we be rationalizing this flexibility business to remain selfish and self-centered — which is believed to be the root of all of our troubles? Who is responsible for seeing that the hand of AA is always extended in love to another suffering drunk? The answer is . . . I am. I am responsible to make twelve step calls whether they seem to be inconvenient or not, to raise my hand when the secretary asks for volunteers to wash cups, to carry my load in whatever branch of service I happen to be in at the time and to always remember that if Alcoholics Anonymous is to be available for the children of the children of alcoholics — Action is the magic word.

I would like to share with you something from Dr. Bob's last major talk because he says it all in one paragraph:

*"We know what A.A. has done in the past 13 years, but where do we go from here? Our membership at present is, I believe, conservatively estimated at 70,000. * Will it increase from here on? Well, that will depend on every member of AA. It is possible for us to grow or not to grow, as we elect. If we fight shy of entangling alliances, if we avoid getting messed up with controversial issues (religious or political or wet-dry), if we maintain unity through our central offices, if we preserve the simplicity of our program, if we remember that our job is to get sober and to stay sober and to help our less fortunate brother to do the same thing, then we shall continue to grow and thrive and prosper."*

Even though 46 years have passed, instead of 13, I feel that we need to continue to place principles before personalities, make certain that anonymity is kept at the level of press radio and films and always be willing to go that extra mile for the people still suffering from this disease of mind and body. If we do those things I feel as strongly as Dr. Bob that we will continue, *ad infinitum!*

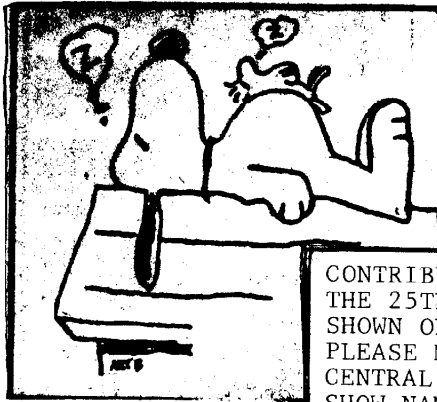

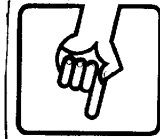

His moral and ethical standards are fabricated on a loom built to suit his own perverted specifications, and the cloak he weaves is as transparent as daylight. No one is deceived except the deceiver; and even he must have his moments when he must admit his life is a sham. The solution for his problem is the same as it is for all of us: "WE PRACTICE THESE PRINCIPLES IN ALL OUR AFFAIRS."

I let go and let God. I let go fear. I let go worry. I let go doubt. I let go anxiety.

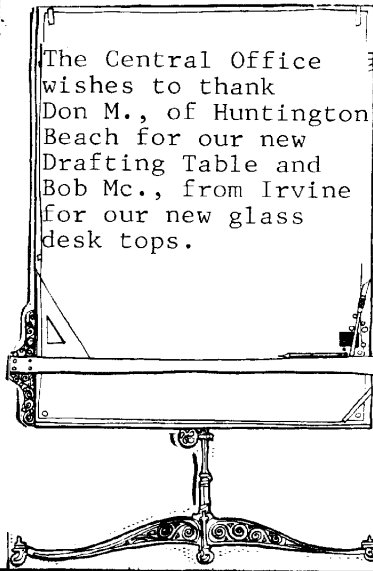

I ATTENDED THE RECENT meeting of the Southern California Archives Committee in the Los Angeles Central Office on May 25, 1981. This committee is made up of members from the Southern California and Mid-Southern Areas who are mostly active in General Service or Intergroups (Central Offices). Anyone interested in the Archives of AA in the two areas is welcome to attend the meetings, which are held at irregular intervals in Los Angeles.

The committee has come up with several interesting projects which may stimulate some older members of AA to give the committee some archive material. Pictures (especially of members who have passed on), records of the early AA meetings, committees and Hospital/Institutional information of the beginning twelve-step work in Los Angeles and Southern California.

A project is being started to prepare a history of this area from the first inception, approximately 1937 to 1945, which will be at the least a start on the history of Alcoholics Anonymous, and will some day be continued through the later years, 1946 to the present. Maurice A., has been assigned the task of final writing of the story. It will take a great deal of time and effort to get this into a narrative form and the committee will welcome help of any kind you can give to bring this to reality.

Bill W., another committee member has been assigned to start a regular AA Archives meeting, likely at LA Central Office each Sunday, at which historical tapes will be presented. The committee has quite a library of these so watch for the announcement of the first meeting.

Authorization was given for more new display panels be made in order to better show the things we have to the general AA public at meetings, conventions, and conferences.

FROM NEW YORK ARCHIVES comes the first edition of a proposed ARCHIVES Bulletin. It contains a wealth of information on how to get interest in our AA beginnings out to the AA member. Quoting the Common Purpose: "...To keep the record straight, so that myth does not predominate over fact as to historical accuracy.

"The function of the archives is to give the Fellowship a sense of its own past and the opportunity to study it.

"The purpose of the Committee is to make recommendations to the General Service Board regarding what should be done and what limitations should be set..."--from the Minutes of the Archives Committee, 1973.

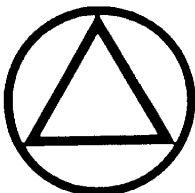
ANONYMITY BREAKS, "bending" of the Twelve Traditions, confusion as to which drug our program is primarily concerned with, promotion rather than attraction in carrying the message, particularly in presenting our AA program to the outside public, engaged in the field of alcoholic recovery or not, these many problems continue to offer us challenges in our daily practice of the twelve steps in our personal lives as well as observance of the suggested Twelve Traditions in our group and committee work.

Alcoholics Anonymous will not perish from the incursions of outside forces, "do-gooders" or persons who wish us to affiliate rather than cooperate in their endeavors to help the alcoholic. I believe our greatest danger lies in our own apathy. Reluctance to engage in the many types of twelve-step work ever present and in which we enrich our own lives are the key to the continued success of AA. It is far better for most of us to participate in some self-sacrificing way than to sit on the sidelines or in the very back row of the meetings we attend. And we must take a stand when these many weakening forces are evident in our fellowship lest our grand children lose the chance for this precious life of sobriety we enjoy and sometimes take for granted.
